October 2017 Deliverables

Work Package 1 - Interim Report

This is the half term report of the work that has been undertaken for the MUSES project during the first year (01/11/16 to 31/10/17). Focusing on work packages 2,3 and 4, this report provides a detailed overview of the work that the MUSES project has completed to date. The report also provides a summary of the work undertaken for work packages 1 and 5. The interim report can be downloaded from our website here.

Work Package 4 - Overview of Stakeholder Profiles

The purpose of this document is to provide an overview of stakeholder profiles, presenting one of the essential steps in development of an Action Plan. The overall aim of stakeholder analysis is to gain a better understanding of the various actors relevant in the context of MU combinations examined in the MUSES project. Taking into consideration different geographical scales, the stakeholder profiles will therefore be developed with specific attention to those actors identified to be behind the drivers and barriers for the MU development in question. This is essential for development of an Action Plan which will be targeting the right type of stakeholders with the right type of action, taking into account national, regional and sea basin dimensions. Specifically, the Action Plan will highlight the real opportunities for MUs in European Seas including the scope for innovation and Blue Growth potential, and propose solutions to overcome existing barriers. The Overview of Stakeholder Profiles will be available to download from the MUSES website later in the year.

Work Package 5 - Exploitation of Results Plan

The purpose of the Exploitation of Results document is to ensure that the MUSES project's aims, progress and results are disseminated effectively to those directly involved in marine spatial planning and multiple uses of the oceans, as well as being easily accessible to a wider audience. This document has been created under deliverable 5.12 and will remain live and be revisited under deliverable 5.13 in the





final month of the project. This document is available to view on the MUSES website here.


MASTS ASM - Sea Change - changing seas, changing times

The focus of this ASM was to "promote the latest advances in marine science, good governance and using sound science responsibly, and revisiting the vision: 'Clean, healthy, safe, productive, biologically diverse marine environments, managed to meet the needs of people and nature"
